DEFINITIONS

Native: existed in a given area pre-European settlement Indigenous: locally adapted natives grown within 80-160kms

Alien/Exotic/Non-Native/Introduced: deliberately or accidentally introduced grown outside of a native range Naturalized: non-native Plant that was introduced, has spread and now grows without human cultivation (ie. Queen Anne's Lace)

Weed: an unwanted plant in a place it intends to stay Wildflower: non-woody (herbaceous) Plant, not modified by humans, reproduces true from seed and grows without human assistance *NOTE* not all wildflowers are native Invasive: "Non-native (or alien) to the ecosystem under consideration; and whose introduction causes or is likely to cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health."
