



GENERAL RULES

- Repeating some of the same plants unites a space
- Using a defined colour/material palette for pots/planters creates unity
- Create a Tableau/scene (left)
- Break-up open areas to define zones
- Boost intimacy by creating nooks
- Plant vertically!
- Borrow and Frame Views
- Skip the lawn!
- Movable/multi-use furniture, fire pits, bench planters, etc.
- Tropical plants with large leaves makes a small space feel larger
- Boldest colours in the front, rest of the garden will 'recede' and feel deeper

COLOUR PREFERENCES

- Monochromatic, Triadic, Analogous, Complimentary & Tetradic
- White & Black Gardens
- In small spaces LESS IS MORE!



GIVE THESE A TRY

- Add an outdoor mirror
- Use tall planters to draw the eye upward
- Use outdoor rugs to help define zones
- Hanging baskets to grow herbs/veggies
- Play with diagonals (left)
- Self watering planters (Maybe products at Home Depot)
- Play with texture of greenery (coarse vs. fine) rather than using a lot of different perennials

PURPOSE OF THE GARDEN

- Seen from inside throughout the year? Seasonal Interest.
- Function? Herbs & Veggies? Water? Storage? Dual-purpose? Moveable?
- Entertaining. Bistro Set.
- Attracting Birds/Pollinators?
- Relaxation?
- Curb Appeal?

DESIGN WITH NATURE

- Boxwood hedge requires regular shaping. Consider planting other plants in a line to create a hedge (ie. Bobo Hydrangea). Keep the natural, form of a plant in mind when making your selection.
- REMEMBER: Snow and road salt goes somewhere – plan! (Boxwood Blight - right)
- Select plants for their leaf texture over the bloom
- Plants will bake if too close to a glass railing + sun
- Plants dry out faster in pots/containers (planter feet/staining)



OTHER THINGS TO CONSIDER

- Water features (low-maintenance) best placed within the garden
- Shop with plant photos (a Plant Palette) in-hand when plant shopping (bottom)

PERENNIALS


- Salvia

- Geraniums (filler)
- Hostas (filler) *SHADE*
- Potato Vine (spiller)
- Grasses, Elephant Ears & Palms (thriller)
- Purple Basil & Curly Parsley (filler) *SUN*
- Angelina Sedum (spiller/filler) *SUN*
- Spider Plants (filler) *SUN/SHADE*





PLANTS THAT KEEP THEIR **TIGHT, COMPACT AND/OR DWARF SHAPE**

- "Wee Bit Grumpy" Hydrangea (will be available at Heeman's!)
- Bobo, Fire Light Tidbit & Little Lime Hydrangeas
- Frans Fontaine Hornbeam (columnar tree)
- Dwarf Moss False cypress
- Sikes Dwarf Oakleaf Hydrangea (see left)
- Dwarf Blue Star Juniper
- Little Gem Norway Spruce
- Gro-Lo Sumac
- Dwarf Variegated Weigela
